HOW TO FEST DURING THE FEST - IN PERSON

LOCATION & PARKING

Green Center @ Colorado School of Mines Campus (924 16th Street, Golden, CO 80401) Street and Lot parking (<u>Blue and Yellow</u>) is available near the Green Center. Parking is FREE after 5pm M-F and all day on the weekends. Otherwise it is \$2/hour with a max of \$10. The entrance to the Green Center is on the West side of the building and the Box Office is inside the Lobby in front of Bunker Auditorium.

*Note: All three theaters are located inside the Green Center on the 1st floor.

FILM SCREENINGS

Tickets are required for all film screenings. Tickets may be reserved (passholders) or purchased in advance or at the door. Events may sell out.

The festival offers a variety of beverages, light snacks throughout the weekend in the Eco-Expo in the Green Center Lobby. Looking for a meal? WATCH ON YOUR COMPUTER/TABLET/PHONE

Using a Safari or Chrome browser, login to your Eventive account on the Online Encore Home and click on My Tickets (under top left drop down MENU). Click WATCH NOW.

WATCH ON YOUR TV - CAST, AIRPLAY, EVENTIVE APP

You can use your smartphone or laptop to cast (Google Chromecast) or Airplay (Apple) the films to your TV. Using a Safari or Chrome browser, login to your Eventive account on the Fest Home and click on My Tickets (under top left drop down MENU). Click WATCH NOW. Cast or Airplay to your TV. Or use the Eventive TV App (For Apple TV or Roku). The Eventive app works with Roku TV device or Apple TV devices.

CONNECT TO COMPUTER VIA HDMI

Using a Safari or Chrome browser, login to your Eventive account on the Fest Home and click on My Tickets (under top left drop down MENU). Connect your computer to your TV with an HDMI cable and change the input of your TV to HDMI. Click WATCH NOW.

Geographic Restrictions dictated by filmmakers and distributors may limit the ability to unlock some sessions. Please check for all restrictions before purchasing or reserving a ticket to ensure you will be able to watch where you are located.

WATCH WINDOWS

This refers to the amount of time you have to complete watching a film collection once you press WATCH NOW. You may pause and restart the collection. You will have 7 days to finish watching your Online Encore collection once you start.
